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
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VOLUME 1: ALAN RICKMAN

ALAN RICKMAN PORTRAYS A SEXY ASS VILLAIN NAMED HANS GRUBER IN DIE HARD. He is the leader of a criminal organization based out of Germany. He's cold, calculating and suave. Dressed in an expensive, tailored suit with styled, fancy hair and a clipped beard, he owns every scene that he's in; from his grand entrance with his swarm of lackeys to his dramatic falling death. 








TRULY, MADLY, DEEPLY. 1990. ANTHONY MINGHELLA.

OH BOY IS THIS MOVIE SAD! Deeply, deeply romantic, but horribly sad. Alan portrays the concept of selflessness in such a raw manner that cannot help but make you love him. He embodies sunshine in his role as Jamie. Jamie is the former boyfriend to the goofy and loving Nina, played by icon Juliet Stevenson. I say former because Jamie is DEAD. The film starts with her processing her grief around his death, but around 20 minutes in, Jamie comes back by an unexplained force (I #love the magic of movies). He's technically a ghost that she can touch, kiss, and so on. They basically go back to how they had been before he died. 



ARGUABLY ALAN RICKMAN'S MOST ATTRACTIVE FILM ROLE EVER. That point comes first because it's crucial to me. Alan plays Colonel Christopher Brandon, a silent, noble and older gentlemen who is interested in courting Marianne Dashwood (aka public enemy #1), the middle daughter of an estranged family who recently moved in nearby the Colonel. He is rich, and according to Mrs. Jennings, one of his family friends, a deeply sad and troubled man with a broken heart. ALAN RICKMAN'S MAGNUM OPUS OF CHARACTERS. Sir Alexander Dane is a miserable, burnt out actor who rose to fame due to a television show called Galaxy Quest (essentially Star Trek). His role on the show was an alien scientist named Dr. Lazarus, who delivered the show's most famous line: "By Grabthar's Hammer, by the Suns of Warvan, you shall be avenged." Due to his extreme popularity but incapability to move away from his association with Galaxy Quest, he is forced to attend conventions and parade himself around while mourning his days of theater when he played Richard III for 5 curtain calls. He is a deeply sarcastic and comedic character that ends up having a profound role in the film. When himself and the other cast members are forced into space by Tim Allen's character (he's basically playing himself; a narcissistic douchebag living in the past), he must take on his fictional role. His brilliance in acting eventually saves their lives, and he develops a bond with a young alien, Quellek, who looks up to him. When Quellek is shot, Alex embraces his iconic line as his way of thanking Quellek for all he did, giving the alien a peaceful send off. I LOVE ALEXANDER AND THIS FILM SO MUCH. SNOWCAKE IS A BRUTAL WATCH. It's an indie film that two big names, Alan Rickman and Sigourney Weaver, did. Alan plays the tragic Alex Hughes, a single man who is grieving the death of a son he had only found out about a month or two before his untimely death. Alex is traveling to meet with his deceased son's mother in order to give her his condolences. On the way, he stops at a gas station restaurant to take a rest before finishing the long drive. There, he runs into a young, eccentric woman named Vivienne. She tries to convince him to give her a ride to her mother's house since it's on the way to his actual destination, and despite his unfriendly facade, Alex agrees. SEVERUS TOBIAS SNAPE, AS I LIVE AND BREATHE! I would've classified Snape as Alan's magnum opus if he didn't severely hate how famous he got for playing him, and if he wasn't written by J.K R*wling. Throughout all 8 films, Snape is a cruel, mysterious and let's be perfectly honest, sexy professor at Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry. He is a brilliant, BRILLIANT wizard, considered to be the 5th most powerful one of ALL TIME. As great as Snape was, Alan hated the attention. But, as someone who deeply relates to Severus, I will forever be grateful that he portrayed him in the manner that he did. 


